Almost forty years ago, Harvey Stallard, PhD, DDS, opened the first International Congress of Gnathology on April 16, 1964, with an address entitled "Forty Years of Gnathology." This defined the first forty-year period in the history of Gnathology, 1924 to 1964. The next forty years of Gnathology, 1964 to 2004, saw the organization of Gnathology and the spread of gnathological concepts throughout the world. Congress XXI welcomes the third forty-year period of gnathology with a look forward to its future in the profession of dentistry. Special emphasis will be placed on new techniques and technologies which can enhance the practice of gnathology.

Registration Fee
